Study your previous exam & quiz. Many components will overlap {specifically: elements & principles of design AND color schemes}.

—>Tips for Success & How to Focus your Studying:

This exam only covers three textbook chapters & one additional reading from Understanding Comics {compared to your first exam, which covered five chapters}. Focusing on bolded vocabulary as well as broad ideas within all assigned readings. Expect the **majority** of the questions on the exam to focus on your assigned readings {chapters 9, 10 & 13 along with Understanding Comics}. There are four weeks of presentations included in this exam {just like your first exam}.

Be able to DEFINE & IDENTIFY:

- All elements & principles of design, perhaps in a matching situation.
- Formal themes within an artwork
- Color schemes within a work of art
- Three primary styles of art {realism, abstraction, non-representational}
- The difference between a Contemporary artist vs. Historical artist
- Have a clear understanding of how form, content, context, material & audience can impact a work of art.
